<p><b>The Night Ministry</b></p> <p><i>Housing for homeless and LGBTQ youth on the streets</i></p>	<p><b>The Night ministry</b> serves youth and adults who face multiple complex challenges on a daily basis, including homelessness, poverty, and abuse. <b>Outreach Services:</b> The Youth Outreach teams reach out to homeless and LGBT youth in Lakeview to offer non-judgmental support, guidance, food and self-care supplies. <b>Pregnant and Parenting Program:</b> The Night Ministry's Open Door program is the only shelter in Chicago that will work with pregnant or parenting teens as young as 14.
